Overview

The Compass HQIC Network supports acute care hospitals with a focus on serving rural and underserved populations. IHC as a Network of Quality Improvement and Innovation Contractor (NQIIC) was eligible to bid on this opportunity and was one of nine awardees.

IHC is working with four state partners to support 279 hospitals throughout the Midwest. The Iowa Hospital Association, South Dakota Association of Healthcare Organizations, Kansas Healthcare Collaborative, and the Mississippi Hospital Association along with systems that cross into Minnesota and Alabama are fully participating in this project. IHC in collaboration with the previously mentioned partners collectively make up the Compass HQIC Network.





Addressing the National Opioid Crisis

Overview

Clinicians and communities across the nation continue to face one of the most devastating public health crises in decades: The overuse and abuse of prescription and illicit opioids. Fortunately, clinicians, healthcare systems, and communities also have the power to reverse the opioid crisis by transforming their practices and collaborating to support their patients and local communities.

In response to the CMS Opioid Prescriber Safety and Support (OPSS) Task Order (TO), the IHC as the single awardee for this TO, has developed the national Compass Opioid Stewardship Certificate Program. This program supports providers through education and outreach to improve prescribing practices and increase the use of non-opioid pain management therapies. The program focuses on reducing the impact of the opioid epidemic by building relationships with those on the frontline of care and teaming with stakeholders to maintain an agile and responsive healthcare system. This program also focuses on the Eight Pillars of Opioid Stewardship and has used these pillars to create a valuable toolkit for enrolled program participants. Locally, IHC leads two lowa based Rural Community Opioid Response Program (RCORP) projects, which is a Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) initiative aimed at reducing the morbidity and mortality of substance use disorders (SUD) and OUD in high-risk rural communities. Each project is driven by local and state leaders committed to working together as a consortium to support the unique needs of high-risk rural communities. Each consortium is focused on strengthening and expanding local SUD/OUD prevention, treatment and recovery services, increasing rural residents' access to treatment with sustainable opportunities for long-term recovery.



Innovations from the Field


