Background



Actions Taken


- Development of a Workplace

- Implementation of the "Code A" process along with staff education
- Improved reporting and analysis of security incidents
- Electronic Flag
- No trespass
- Implementation of a stronger deescalation response process
- Increase in Security Workforce to provide 24/7 ED waiting room coverage
- Prominent "No Violence" Signage
- Ballistic glass around ED registration

Next Steps

- Installation of additional video monitors at hospital entrances
- Develop alert process for departments who do not utilize Cerner
- Evaluate hours of police presence in Emergency Departments
- Implementation of Broset Violence Checklist

Analysis

- Increasing violence across the industry with highest prevalence in hospitals, emergency departments and long-term care facilities
- Hospital / ED nurses are the most common victims of assault
- Disrupts care and consumes hospital resources that may impact the care of other patients
- Multidisciplinary focus has created awareness throughout Genesis leading to increased reporting.
